## General Rules and Regulations:

1. If you have a flower that is not listed in the categories, please bring it and we will enter it. We love having new and different entries. New entries help our Flower Show to grow and be more interesting every year.
2. Patrons will enter flowers in CLEAR GLASS display containers. The container is not judged (except in artistic arrangements). Remember judges consider the stems and foliage, so container should not obstruct view of the stems and foliage.
3. Specimens will be entered as "Best Display" unless otherwise specified in the book. Example: Three to five stems of Asters, Petunias, or Marigolds will display well for judging. Sweet Peas and other small flowers take ten stems or more for a better showing. Display must be of one variety.
4. Entries must be grown by the exhibitor; no more than one (1) of each class may be entered.
5. Exhibitors are encouraged to replace flowers after judging is complete and anytime during the fair to keep flowers looking fresh.
6. All flowers in the artistic display must be garden grown. Foliage or greens, not native to the flowers being displayed may be used in artistic bouquets and arrangements. Baby's Breath, Static, and other flowering fillers are not acceptable in arrangements of ONE KIND.
7. No artificial flowers in arrangements will be allowed. Artificial flowers can be entered in the Hobby/Crafts.
8. For efficiency, enter as early in the day as possible. ALL displays should be entered under the correct Division. Premiums will be paid on blue and red and white ribbons only.
9. ROSETTES do not receive extra premium money!
10. ROSE EXHIBITORS: If your rose has a name, please put the name on the Exhibit Tag. If there are enough roses in one variety, they will be judged in their own category.
11. Gladiolus are judged based on dominant color.
12. Be aware that Superintendents and helpers are not responsible for getting your entries in the correct age division. Any entry without a sticker or any information on it will be placed in the adult division.

HINTS FOR EXHIBITING FLOWERS

1. Cut flowers and plant material in early morning or late in the afternoon. Cut the stem on a slant. Place freshly cut flowers and plant material immediately in deep warm water with flower preserve packet.
2. Place in a cool, dark room away from drafts (i.e.: heat or air conditioning) for several hours or overnight.
3. Place water in container before starting design. Make sure all stems are cut on a slant.
4. To keep designs fresh, avoid putting any leaves or petals under water.
5. A spray is several flowers or clusters of flowers on a branched stem, each having its own stem. (i.e.: petunias or cosmos)
6. A bloom is a single flower on one stem. (i.e.: Zinnia, Dahlia, Rose)
7. A spike is a lengthened flower cluster in which flowers are practically stemless. (i.e.: Snapdragons, Gladiolus)
