Rules:

- 1- Each article submitted for entry must be the *sole work* of the entrant; teachers may guide and advise only.
- 2- Each piece must have been made in its entirety in the past two years and never been exhibited at the Minidoka County Fair previously.
- 3- *All* articles are required to have been fired in a ceramic kiln at temperatures exceeding 800 degrees, including "tables and chess boards".
- 4- All liability and responsibility for the security of the ceramic pieces or breakage while on the show premises is to be assumed by the exhibitors.
- 5- Each person can enter one piece of a set in each class number.
- 6- No shades on lamps, unless ceramic, should be entered and no electrical hookup.
- 7- Judges' decisions are final. No complaints may be made during judging.
- 8- Hot glue cannot be used on entries.
- 9- All entrants are to abide by the rules.
- 10-Dolls must be on a proper stand with substantial support.
- 11-All accessories on dolls must be securely attached.
