GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS:

ATTENTION: If you have a flower that is not listed in the categories, please bring it and we will enter it. We love having new and different entries. That helps our Flower Show to grow and be more interesting every year. Regarding "Flower Gardener of the Year" Winners of the previous year and received an Award from Vicki's Country Garden is not eligible for two years.

ATTENTION: We will not be pre-registering the flowers this year. We will use the old program in the flower Department. CHECK IN FAIR OFFICE FOR MASTER NUMBER.

1. Patrons will enter flowers in CLEAR GLASS display containers. The container is not judged, (except in artistic arrangements), remember judges consider the stems and foliage also, so container should not obstruct view of the above said items.
2. Specimens will be entered as "Best Display" unless otherwise specified in the book. Example: Three to five stems of Asters, Petunias, or Marigolds will display well for judging. Sweet Peas and other small flowers take ten stems or more for a better showing. Display must be of one variety.
3. Entries must be grown by the exhibitor; no more than one (1) of each class may be entered. Exhibitors are encouraged to replace flowers after judging is complete. (Anytime during the Fair)
4. All flowers in artistic display must be garden grown. Foliage or greens, not native to the flowers being displayed may be used in artistic bouquets and arrangements. Baby's Breath, Static and other flowering fillers are not acceptable in arrangements of ONE KIND.
5. No artificial flowers or arrangements will be allowed. They can be entered in the Hobby/Crafts.
6. For efficiency; enter as early in the day as possible. ALL displays should be entered under correct Division.. Premiums will be paid on blue and red and white ribbons only.
7. ROSETTES RECEIVE NO EXTRA PREMIUM MONEY!
8. ROSES EXHIBITS: If your rose has a name, please put the name on the Exhibit Tag. If there are enough roses in one variety, they will be judged in their own category.

HINTS FOR EXHIBITING FLOWERS

1. Cut flowers and plant material in early morning or late in the afternoon. Place flowers and plant material immediately in deep warm water. Cut end of stem on slant.
2. Place in cool, dark room or out of drafts (from heat or air conditioning). Do this for several hours or overnight.
3. Place water in container before starting design. Cut stems at an angle.
4. To keep designs fresh, avoid any leaves or petals under water.
5. A spray is several flowers or clusters or flowers on a branched stem, each having its own stem. (Example: petunias or cosmos) A bloom is a single flower on one stem. (Example: Zinnia, Dahlia, Rose)
6. A spike is lengthened flower cluster in which flowers are practically stem less. (Example: Snapdragons, Gladiolus)
